



What will you learn about in Music?

Students within KS3 Music lessons explore a variety of genres and musical styles. Students are able to experience performing and composing using the most current equipment and software. From Year 7 through to Year 9 students learn about a range of musical styles while being creative individually and as different sized ensembles all the way up to large whole class ensembles. Students are encouraged to work on and include the prior knowledge, opinions and skills of music. Year 7 students explore rhythm, singing, reading music and the history of music among others.
