# National Scientific Thinking Challenge



In 2021, a group of friends from 6 different university chemistry departments created a test for Year 10 students to try. It was the middle of the pandemic and learning had been badly disrupted.

They worked at Warwick,
Southampton, Bristol, Newcastle,
Manchester and Oxford Universities
and wanted to encourage students and
give them something positive and
enjoyable to try at a difficult time.

After more than 6,000 people took the test, and positive feedback from teachers and students saying how much they enjoyed the challenge, they decided to make this an annual event.

This year four classes from Durrington High School entered the challenge in which students had to answer 34 questions in 50 minutes. No revision was undertaken and the questions were all based on the analysis of the tables and graphs.

Over 13.6K students took part from across the country and those scoring in the top 10% were awarded gold, the top 25% silver, and the top 40% bronze.

Our students did amazingly well and achieved 9 golds, 8 silvers, and 22 bronze!

## Duke of Edinburgh qualifier expedition

In stark contrast to the when the practice expedition was completed in the wet weather in March, the sun shone for the whole weekend at the end of May when the 4 teams completed their expedition section of their Bronze Award. Teams started just north of Falmer and hiked up and over the South Downs towards Plumpton and the good weather helped boost their energy levels as nearly all teams completed the first day in good time. As part of their expedition challenge, teams had to complete a project along the way of their choice, and so one team recorded the amount of litter they found, while another team took photos of a toy lizard at various notable points along the way.

At the overnight campsite, the local ice cream van allowed us to reward the teams' efforts of the first day with 99's before they pitched their tents and then cooked their evening meals, ending their day relaxing with card games and ball games. All were in bed by 10pm since the next morning they were up by 6am to get breakfast cooked, cleared up



and kit packed away ready for their second day start at 9am.

This time the teams headed south towards Ditchling before heading back over the steep escarpment slope of the South Downs towards Brighton, passing the Chattri Indian War memorial before finishing by the A27. Again, the sun shone the whole way, and the assessors who had been monitoring the teams were very complimentary about how well the they had done in the heat.

In September Year 10 students will be able to sign up for the next Bronze Award launch so look out for more details.







#### **DHS Careers week**

There has been a buzz around the school this week as the students have been engaging with over 20 employers and vocational college departments. Briefings on each day's visitors have gone out each morning along with challenge questions. These have covered topics such as the impact of AI on the future job market and what it means for a job to make a difference.

School staff have been displaying pathway plaques on their doors to encourage discussions about their career journey and the skills they've learned along the way. Quizzes and challenges have also been running

through the week with the Year 7 & 8 passport stamp challenge proving very popular.







The visitor feedback has been amazing, and we have been so impressed with how engaged the students have been as well as with the confidence they've shown in talking to them each day. We want to develop the idea of broad options and these sorts of events are really valuable in helping young people explore future possibilities.

#### **Anais Merritt - Year 10**






