# Diversity across the curriculum ...

This week has certainly been diverse as staff across the curriculum have planned themed lessons in KS3 to embrace Diversity Week at DHS.

English: students wrote their own ghazal which is a form of Arabic poetry that has two major rules as the poem must contain five or more couplets, and have a rhyme or repeated refrain.

Maths: students designed their own Rangoli patterns which are associated with Diwali, these are placed indoors as a welcome to the Hindu Goddess Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth. Students also learnt about the origins of Algebra as well as playing maths games from around the world.

**Science:** Edward Bouchet, the American physicist and educator, who was the first African American to earn

a Ph.D, was the topic in science and students carried out an experiment linked to his research.

**History**: discussions on diasporas in Britain took place, looking at different cultures who have been displaced from their country of origin and now live and contribute to the society we live in.

**Geography:** focused on 'moving stories' and looked at the impacts of migration on the UK.

**SME**: students looked at the LGBTQ+ faith and immigration in our changing population.

**Textiles**: Indian textiles were explored such as suzani, muslin, organza and voile with students exploring the origin of these fabrics and designing their own patterns and costumes.



**Drama:** lessons involved students sharing their choral voice and movement as they explored a poem about diversity.

Music: samba workshops on the field were enjoyed by all and students also wrote their own lyrics about diversity.

Art: students looked at the huge array of diversity in the arts which is central to the vitality of creativity and culture to be found.

DT: students were challenged to design an environment or product that can be accessed and used by as many people as possible, regardless of age, gender and disability.

**Food**: students researched food choices relating to religion, culture, ethical and moral beliefs.

PE: sports across the cultures were taught including lacrosse, badminton, softball and cricket, as well as looking at the impact of social groupings on participation of sport based on race, religion, culture, disability, gender, age and family and friends influence.

MFL: students were introduced to the use of non-binary pronouns in languages used around the world.

Computing: the focus was on Alan Turing who helped create one of the first computer machines to crack the German codes, as well as how machines today are adapted to help all sectors of society gain access.




