

### **Project College Launch**

Project College is our support programme for all students to find their best pathway after Year 11. It was launched last Monday with packs going home and made available online. This has been accompanied by SME lessons and period 1 talks. Students have also received assembly presentations from a school 6<sup>th</sup> Form and a land based college to encourage them to explore alternative provisions. Mr Henry our Careers Leader said, "It has been fantastic to hear the ideas that Year 11 students are starting to develop. Researching and planning can increase their chance of success." The careers library is open to all students at both break times and after school when students need support.



### **Y11 Careers Evening**

An important part of Project College is our annual careers evening and we had a fantastic turnout this year with students and their families visiting over 25 colleges, schools and training providers. The NHS, HMRC and GSK were each having brilliant conversations with their future employees. Mr Henry said, "Although I was in the LRA meeting and supporting families, reports from our guests were consistent. So many of our students were asking really good questions and were curious about what's on offer. The more options they can explore, the better chance each young person has of finding the right path."

### **Y10 Work Experience**

#### Xello

Students all have access to a personalised careers platform called Xello. This can be launched by students from the top bar of the school website, and we encourage them to share the experience with those supporting them at home. It uses their school login. They can explore job ideas, take tests, look at pathways and create plans for the future. This is not introduced to Year 7s until the end of the Summer term but its available for all curious students from Day 1.

# Year 11

The Year 11 <u>handbook</u> has been sent home to parents/carers and students. This contains advice on tracking your child's progress, key dates, revision materials and revision sessions, plus lots more useful information to support you and your child in their final year.

The Y11 extra revision opportunities take place before and after school each day, providing further opportunities for your child to practice and embed key content and skills with a subject specialist.

Morning sessions run from 8am to 8.30am, and period 7 after school from 3.15pm to 4.15pm.

# Computing @DHS

Year 7, have been looking at e-safety these past few weeks, from phishing emails to YouTube targeting children with Ai disinformation.

Year 8 students have started the year looking at how our data is encrypted and learning some of the different methods how data is safely stored on the Pc from substitution ciphers all the way to the enigma machine used in the war.

Year 9 students have started the year looking at cyber crime, from how and why people hack the laws associated with this. They are now learning about the different computer viruses that can occur and more importantly how to prevent them.

We have been really impressed with the start that our GCSE students have made with Year 10 Business looking at entrepreneurs and what it takes to be one. Year 10 Computer Science students are programming at the moment, and are becoming fluent in the python language.

Year 11 Business students are busy preparing for their mocks and learning how to give business advice based on all their knowledge and experience from the course.
