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



## **Black History Month**

Black History Month has been marked in the UK for more than 30 years and takes place during the month of October.

This week at Durrington we have held special assemblies to all year groups to celebrate Black History Month and to promote and celebrate contributions to society from black citizens, as well as to increase our understanding of Black History in general, as it has often been overlooked and forgotten.

During our weekly period 1 Friday chat students were encourage to discuss how can education around Black History be useful to combat discrimination. Plus why is it important to have role models from diverse backgrounds, and we focused on two of our House's Seacole and Angelou.

Mary Seacole was a British-Jamaican born in 1805.

She grew up helping her mother care for soldiers who were stationed in the West Indies.

When the Crimean War broke out, she wished to go along as a nurse to care for soldiers.

She was rejected, so she went out there funded by her own money, helping treat cholera, a very deadly disease.



Maya Angelou was an American author, poet and civil rights activist. She has written several books based on her life experiences as a black woman in the US, which have won dozens of awards.

Her most acclaimed book is called 'I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings.' In 2010, Obama posthumously awarded her the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest civilian honour in the US.

Lots of fun was had by all and this club has spaces for more students to join so come along and learn some new skills whilst making friends.



Code club is off to a great start this term, the students are getting to grips with python programming to create a text adventure game.




### **Year 7 lessons**
