As a new SSLT running our first charity event of this year (the recent collection of clothes & coats for three local charities) we were blown away by how generous people were in their donations. It was quite something to see a room packed floor to ceiling with so many bags, and to do a few more trips than we thought to load these onto the charity vans and get them away to the good causes locally we are supporting. In total more than 5000 items were donated – an amazing achievement and thank you!

We also wanted to let you, our great parents/carers, know about the final kindness related challenge of this term. It has been a Durrington tradition for many years that we support our local community and particularly those in greatest need at Christmas time through the creation of Christmas hampers . The hamper filling and making is great fun as a form group to do, however, we do need

your support (if you are able to obviously) in helping to donate items to go into them. A couple of years ago we also added Christmas stockings to our kindness at Christmas challenge and we will be doing these again this year. Put simply, these are small decorated Christmas stockings & that we fill with new items such as chocolate, a new toy, book or game and then we donate these to children aged 5-10 who are identified as living in extreme poverty locally via our local primary schools.

By again showing these small acts of kindness we know we will make a difference (in a good way) to those who have harder lives then many of us. We completely understand that not everyone will be able to donate items given the pressures in people's lives; however, if you can we would really appreciate your support. A wonderful experience with some of the students experiencing a West End musical for the very first time, interval ice cream prices were a revelation to





We are super proud of what every student has produced. Every student going beyond their best, showing pride and high expectations in all they do!







## National CyberFirst




The National CyberFirst Girls

Headquarters.


Last week we entered 6 teams from year 8 into the competition. This national competition aims to inspire girls interested in technology to pursue a career in cyber security while breaking barriers in the maledominated field of cybersecurity.

The competition is a team event. Each team tackles challenges from cryptography and logic to artificial intelligence and networking for the chance to be crowned cyber security champions. The teams worked really well together, with many not knowing their team members when they started the day. They communicated well, worked hard and did not give up... even when some of the challenges were really tough.

The teams had a couple of hours of training in the cyber security world with Mrs Taylor and Mr Scott, before making a start on the competition.



The competition contains some advanced cyber topics that are not covered in traditional education but will seek to stretch the lateral thinking and additional cyber knowledge of the teams.



The students had until the 29<sup>th</sup> November to complete the competition tasks away from the classroom. We hope that some of our teams will progress to the next round.







The first debate was won by the proposition team, led by Matilda Cutting and Ivy Robertson, who successfully argued that "Artificial intelligence is a threat to humanity".


The next debate will help to get us into the festive spirit, debating whether or not Christmas is still a religious holiday. Well done to everyone who has taken part so far!
