

We stayed on campus in university halls that night ready for the presentation the next morning. Although a little nervous Siaana Hearn, Jasmine Lawrence, Darcie Wilmott and Tamsin Pollard presented their answer to the question that got them a place in the final to a panel of senior university lecturers. They were confident and relaxed when explaining how they reached their final answer using Powerpoint and props. The girls excelled when answered questions from the judges. During the day at the University the students got a real feel for university life, seeing the fantastic sports facilities, the media centre amongst other areas of the campus.
