

Year 7

We have been so proud of how the Year 7s have settled in this year. As a year group, we have the best attendance, with our highest performing classes, 7RBe and 7ZLe, at 96.3%. 7RBe were our most improved form this half term and we gave out stacks of 96+% and 100% attendance letters. Our KAPP successes were too notable, with around 1000 KAPP badges being given out across Year 7, whilst 7KFo won both the 'Kindness Passport' and 'Summer Aspiration' challenges. 199 students received Perseverance badges after their first tracking point, with 119 students getting more than one of these awarded 'Ps' in their report and 22 students getting more than 5! A particular well done to: Emily Slaughter, who received 8 'Ps'; Ava Findlay-Evans & Elsa Cannon, who received 9 'Ps'; and Jenson Blackman, who received a whopping 10 'Ps' from his last report. Additionally, 33 students received their Bronze Seahorses, meaning they have received all of their bronze KAPP badges! The overall class winners were 7ZLe, who earnt 126 badges. This half term, Minecraft was the highest attended club with 7KFo attending the most clubs out of all the classes. Georgia Jeffery was our highest club attender for the girls, whilst Mrinal Shrestha was the highest for the boys and William Coventry attended the widest variety of clubs. We have had so many KAPP signatures this half term and as a team we couldn't be prouder. Well done Year 7, keep up the good work!




Congratulations to Megan Neal - Platinum Seahorse for Aspiration, and Jack Calvert - Bronze Seahorse and Silver Aspiration award.






