When students read for enjoyment, they're more likely to achieve higher grades across all subjects. But beyond that, they gain a lifelong habit that supports mental wellbeing, focus, and creativity.

You, as parents and carers, are key partners in nurturing this habit. Encouraging your child to read at home—even just 15 minutes a day—can make a huge difference. Talk to them about what they're reading, visit the local library together, or share your own

favourite books. Creating a relaxed reading space at home and limiting screen time before bed can also help make reading a natural part of their routine.

We're proud of how our brilliant LRA staff, teachers and teaching assistants promote reading for pleasure, both in and out of lessons. But the greatest impact comes when home and school work together.

Let's continue to inspire our young people to discover the power and pleasure of reading—not as a task, but as a gift. We'll be sharing more of our plans on this, with you in the new school year.

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Careers Week 2025 Inspiring futures at Durrington

From 9th to 12th June, Durrington High School hosted an inspiring Careers Week, packed with opportunities for students to explore future pathways and discover a wide range of industries. Each morning began with a briefing from Mr Henry, highlighting the day's visitors and sparking discussion on careers abroad and how jobs have evolved. Quizzes and activity sheets helped get everyone involved. Lunchtimes brought a vibrant mix of industry guests. Students could chat, take part in activities, and gather useful insights. Year 7s collected stamps in their careers passports, with prizes for the top tutor group.



Visitors offered something for all interests - from house valuations with Bacon and Co to bug handling with Brinsbury College and bridge building with HOP Consulting. Worthing College's sports challenges and a farming stand with a real tractor were student favourites. Industry Spotlight talks expanded this year with sessions from Rolls Royce, HOP Consulting, Gatwick Airport, and local colleges. Fiona from Grace Dance gave an inspiring talk on starting your own business. New this year was early access for supported students and over 65 classroom visits where professionals gave mini-talks and answered questions.

Students can also visit during break and lunchtimes, as well as after school until 4pm, where they can use the computers, choose a board game to play with friends, catch up on homework, or select a new book to read. 
